DEFINITION OF LIBERTY

A man's liberty is based on the principles of self-ownership and unfettered free will. I own my life. To deny this is to imply that another party has a higher claim on my life than I have. No other party, or group of people or persons, owns my life nor do I own the lives of others.

My liberty exists with me in time; my past, my present, and my future. This is manifest in my life, my liberty, and the product of my life and of my liberty.

The free will to exercise choices over my life and over my liberty is my prosperity. To lose my life is to lose my future. To lose my liberty is to lose my present. And to lose the product of my life and liberty is to lose the portion of my past that produced it.

For another to take my life is murder; to take my liberty is enslavement; and to take my property is theft. To pretend to have authority to take of my liberty, or to take of my property, without my voluntary consent, is fraud.

It is fraud whether these aspects of my liberty or of my property were taken from me by one party acting alone, by the many acting against a few, or even by officials with fine hats and titles of governments.
